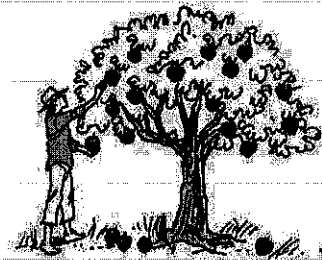

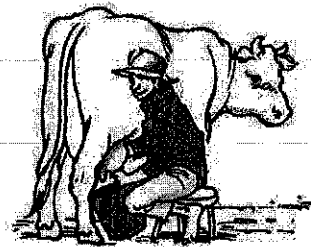

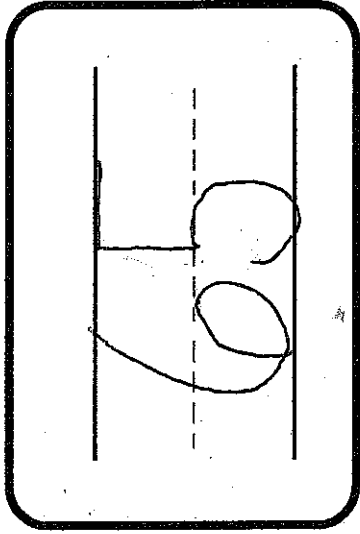
A **verb** tells about the subject of a sentence.

The Writing Process

A story or a poem is easy to write when you have a plan. First, think about what you want to write, who you are writing for, and why you are writing. Then use these five steps to plan your writing.



PREWRITING

Make a list of ideas to write about. Draw a picture or make a chart of the idea you choose.



DRAFTING

Write about your prewriting idea.
Do not worry about making a mistake.



RESPONDING AND REVISING

Meet with a partner to talk about your draft.
Think about any changes you want to make.



PROOFREADING

Reread or read aloud your revised draft.
Fix any mistakes you find.



PUBLISHING

Think about how you want to share your work.
